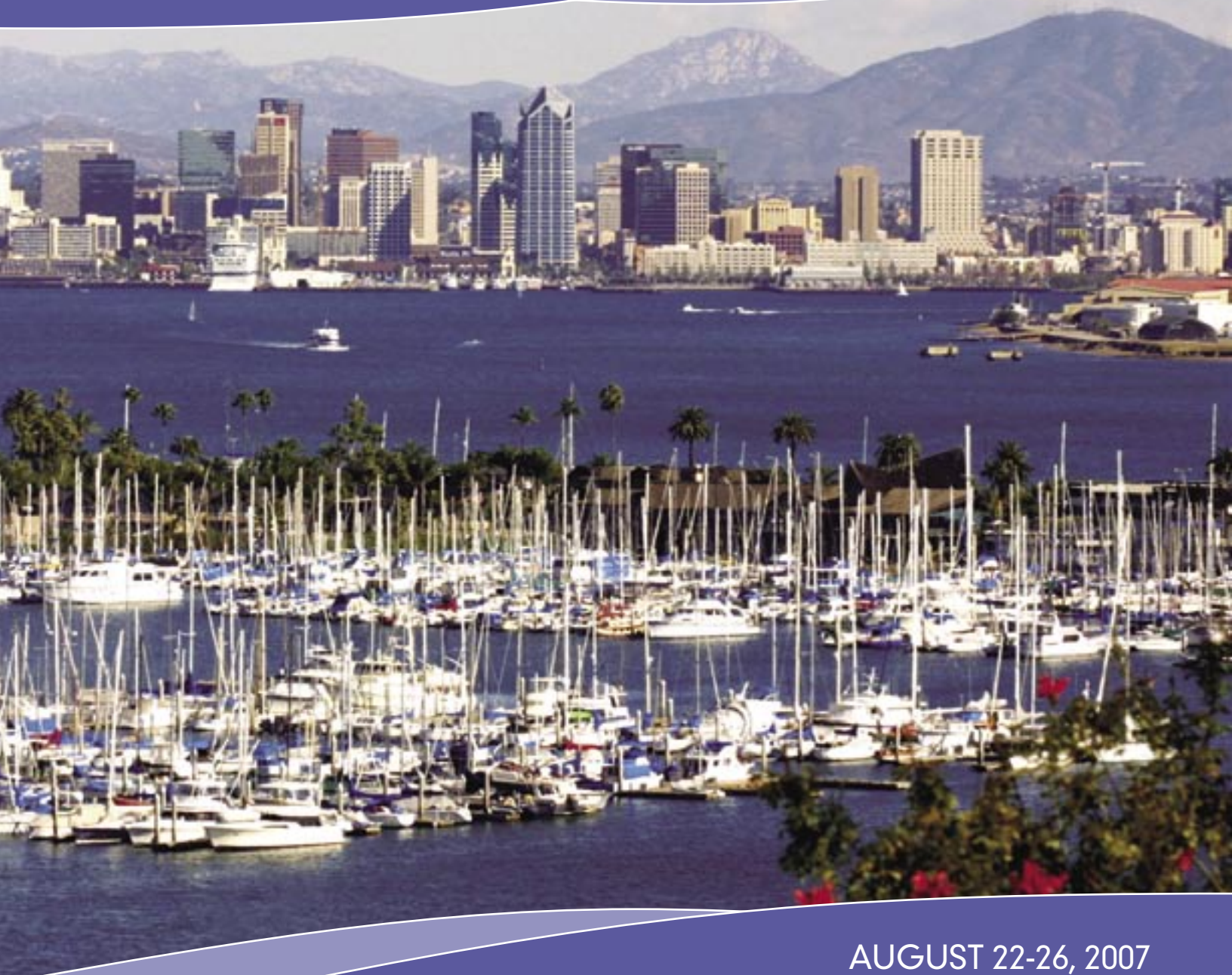

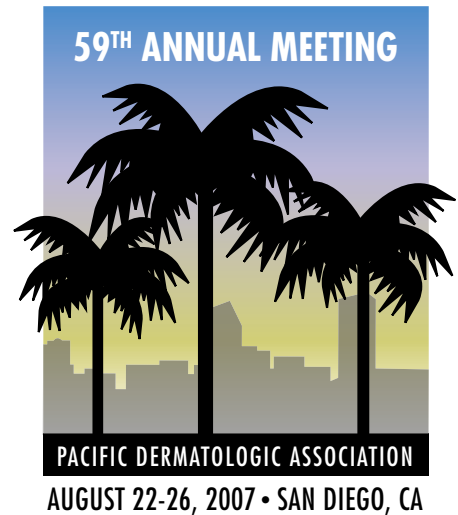


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LEADERSHIP FORUM: LEARN HOW TO BECOME A LEADER

CALL FOR CASES AND AWARDS

Clinicopathologic Conference Cases Deadline: June 30, 2007

The Pacific Dermatologic Association (PDA) is looking for high-quality cases to be presented at the Walter R. Nickel / Louis H. Winer Dermatopathology CPC, to be held during the PDA's 59th Annual Meeting this August in San Diego, California. One of the most popular sessions offered at each PDA meeting, the CPC will feature the presentation and discussion of the clinical and histopathological correlations of interesting and cutting-edge dermatology cases.

Cases will be chosen primarily on the basis of quality, but if two similar cases are submitted, preference will be given to the case that was submitted first. Each submitter of a case that is chosen for the CPC will be recognized by name, and their case (including pictures) will be published in the CPC syllabus.

To encourage an increased number of submissions, the PDA has made a few important changes in the submission process starting in 2005. In the past, a number of great cases were not submitted due to a small specimen or insufficient material to cut the number of slides required. We now ask for two (2) H & E stained slides and four (4) unstained slides (for possible special stains). The slides can be made from serial sections to allow for conservation of the material in the tissue block. If you prefer, you can send the tissue block and we can cut the sections.

Please note that we still require clinical photos for all submitted cases and these can either be in the form of a digital picture or kodochrome slide. Contributors to the 2007 CPC will receive a CD containing all presented cases, including the powerpoint slides that will be shown at the meeting.

NICKEL/WINER "BEST CPC CASE" AWARD

The PDA will be presenting a plaque at the conclusion of the CPC Conference to the best submitted case as judged by the CPC Chairperson and the guest dermatopathologists.



To submit a case, please enclose the following materials:

1. One-page clinical history and findings (submission forms can be downloaded at <http://www.pacificderm.org/pdfs/CPCCallforCases07.pdf>)
2. 1-2 high quality clinical photographs in the form of a 2x2 slide or digital photo (preferred). Note: This photo will be published in the CPC Syllabus if your case is chosen.
3. Either one of the following:
 - 2 H & E slides, 4 unstained standard glass slides
 - One paraffin-embedded tissue block containing at least enough tissue to make 6 slides

RESIDENT CASE PRESENTATIONS

Deadline: June 30, 2007

The Resident Case presentations will take place on Sunday, August 26, 2007 during PDA's 59th Annual Meeting in San Diego, California. Submitted cases should have good teaching value and good clinical slides. The presentation itself should be no more than six minutes in duration and should allow time for one to two questions.

Eligibility

Submission to be a presenter is open to Dermatology residents in any of the Pacific Rim countries, Canada, Mexico and the Western United States including Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Texas, Washington and Wyoming.

Travel Expenses

Reimbursement for hotel accommodations and travel expenses with a comprehensive maximum of \$500 will be distributed upon submission of proper documentation (i.e., receipts).

Award

The best resident presenter will receive the Arnold W. Gurevitch Award. The recipient will be given a commemorative certificate, will be entitled to two years of free membership to the PDA following the completion of their residency and will receive \$200.

Evaluation

The resident presenters will be judged on the following criteria:

1. Uniqueness of the case
2. Clarity of Presentation
3. Audiovisual including graphic slides and clinical photographs

Victor D. Newcomer, MD

Victor D. Newcomer (April 5, 1916 - March 15, 2002) was a Clinical Professor of Medicine (Dermatology) at UCLA's School of Medicine and a clinician in private practice in Santa Monica, California. A gifted teacher and leader, he received countless accolades including the prized Golden Apple Award from both UCLA and the

California Medical Association. Dr. Newcomer was an esteemed and beloved educator, mentor, and role model throughout the Dermatologic community and amongst his students. His life exemplified his dedication and commitment to excellence in teaching and academics. In honor of his memory, the PDA has established the Victor D. Newcomer Award to encourage residents and new practicing clinicians of Dermatology to strive for excellence in their own work.

Eligibility

The Victor D. Newcomer Award is open to physicians currently enrolled in a graduate dermatologic training program or physicians that have completed their training less than 5 years ago.

Any clinical research, basic science research or clinically focused review may be submitted for consideration for this award.

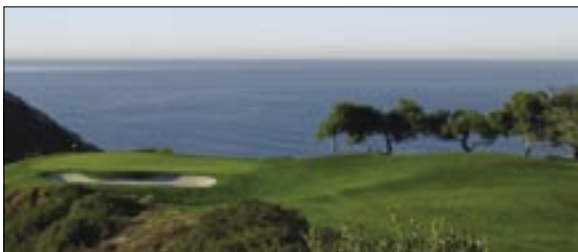
Golf Tournament: Steele Canyon Golf Course
